TIMELY NOTIFICATION BULLETIN

Possible Threat to the Community

"Your Right to Know"

November 29, 2010

OFFENSE: Sexual Assault

LOCATION: Railroad tracks between Newman Dr and K-Lot.

TIME: Early morning hours of Sunday, November 7, 2010 between 03:00 AM and 04:00 AM.

SUSPECT: Unknown Black Male wearing a black jacket, dark colored jeans or jogging pants.

In compliance with the "Timely Notice" provisions of the federal *Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998* the James Madison University Police are giving notice of an alleged incident of sexual assault from early November that was reported to the University Department on Monday November 29, 2010.

The JMU Police Department's Criminal Investigations Division is investigating an incident that reportedly occurred during the early morning hours of November 7, 2010. A female victim reported that a black male confronted her on the railroad tracks between Newman Dr and K-Lot where she was sexually assaulted. The victim did not reveal the incident had occurred until she was at home over the Thanksgiving Holiday.

The case is still being actively investigated by law enforcement. Members of the University community are urged to be vigilant and report any unusual circumstances and/or suspicious activities/persons immediately to police.
