Early Childhood Education

The JMU Young Children's Program, educating 3 and 4 year olds, has increased student enrollment by 30% since 2019.

Early Childhood initiatives aim to increase equity, quality, capacity, and stability in Early Childhood Education by working with early childhood professionals, families, and leaders.

Applied Behavior Analysis

Partnering with local public schools and private agencies to support educators, students, and practitioners

Providing internships for students studying applied behavior analysis

Bachelor's of Individualized Study (BIS)

Three cohorts: Early Childhood (birth -age 5), Elementary Education (K-6), and Special Education (K-12)

Over 85 students enrolled while working concurrently in the field

Military Science

Ranked #1 out of 38 universities in a seven-state region, including Washington, D.C., for the highest percentage of contract mission. Also placed #1 of 38 universities for nurses contracted.

Completed the model ROTC classroom. Recognized by senior leadership at the United States Army Cadet Command as the model classroom for leader development.
