



Corrine A. Loudon has served as the Chief Deputy Inspector General for the Office of the State Inspector General since August 2018. A native of Oxfordshire, England, Corrine began her career at Longwood College (now University) with an internship in the Office of Internal Audit. Another internship with the Auditor of Public Accounts (APA) landed her first full-time job in state government as a financial management auditor. At age 26, Corrine became a Controller for the Commonwealth’s \$1 billion “Bond Bank,” Virginia Resources Authority.
