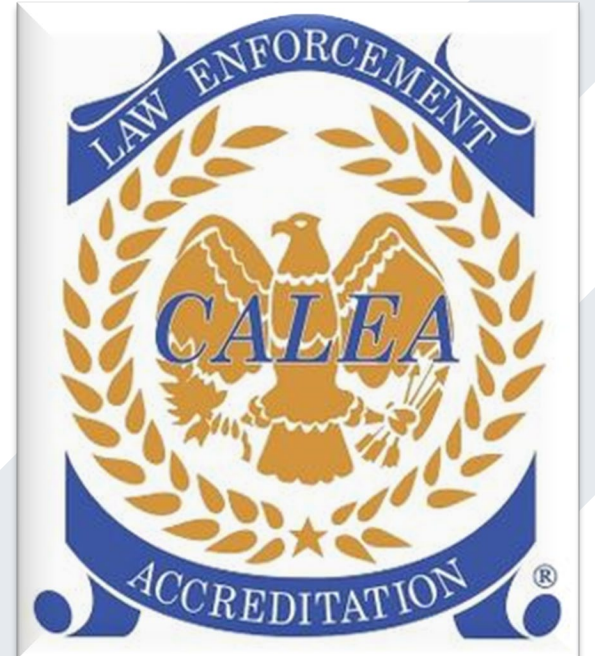

Police Department Accreditation

- **CALEA** Advanced Accreditation since 2019
- **IACLEA** Accreditation since 2020
- Annual Reviews Required
- Compliance with 461 Standards
- 12,000+ Proofs Collected over 4 years
- Less than 3% of Colleges and Universities obtain both accreditations

- 2023** ○ Implementation of Open Gate Weapon Detection Systems

Planned Post Game Police Operations

- Provide traffic control for efficient egress
- Increase patrol operations to 25 officers to manage post game activities around the campus community
- Ensure priority calls for service are answered efficiently
- Maintain high visibility to reduce the likelihood of criminal and/or disruptive activity

Threat Assessment Team

Purpose

The Threat Education Assessment & Management team is a cross-functional, multidisciplinary group committed to identifying, evaluating and managing the risks associated with certain behaviors that may pose a threat to the campus community's safety.

Authority: Virginia Code § 23-9.2:10

Responsibilities

- **Educate** the campus community to identify and report behaviors of concern
- **Evaluate** referrals for risk of targeted violence or self-harm
- **Refer** appropriately to university officials, mental health professionals, and/or law enforcement agencies
- **Develop** and help implement preventative safety measures for potential target(s) of violence
- **Consult** with the Monarch community about their safety concerns
- **Respond** judiciously with recommended action for those who exhibit behaviors of concern
- **Policy & Procedure** proposals, revisions, and recommendations that advance campus safety

GUARDIANSCORE

1. Guardian Score is the collection of data reflecting the public's perception of an officer's adherence to the tenets of procedural justice.
2. Allows community members to rate their police interaction based on the officer's ability to:
 - Explain "why"
 - Listening skills
 - Fairness
 - Professionalism
 - The officer's ability to explain next steps
3. Helps police departments improve legitimacy with their community, while also providing new and meaningful performance metrics for police performance evaluations.

Traffic Improvements

Hampton Blvd

- Enhanced pedestrian safety
- Walk and traffic light timing changed at all crossing intersections
- Allows pedestrians to enter crosswalk prior to light change
- Working with Norfolk Traffic Engineering to install No Turn on Red signs
- Camera additions at 45th Street intersection

49th Street

- Speeding concerns
- Bluestone Av. crosswalk/3-way stop intersection
- Speed warning data collection system
- Focused on speed enforcement and Bluestone Av. Crosswalk violations

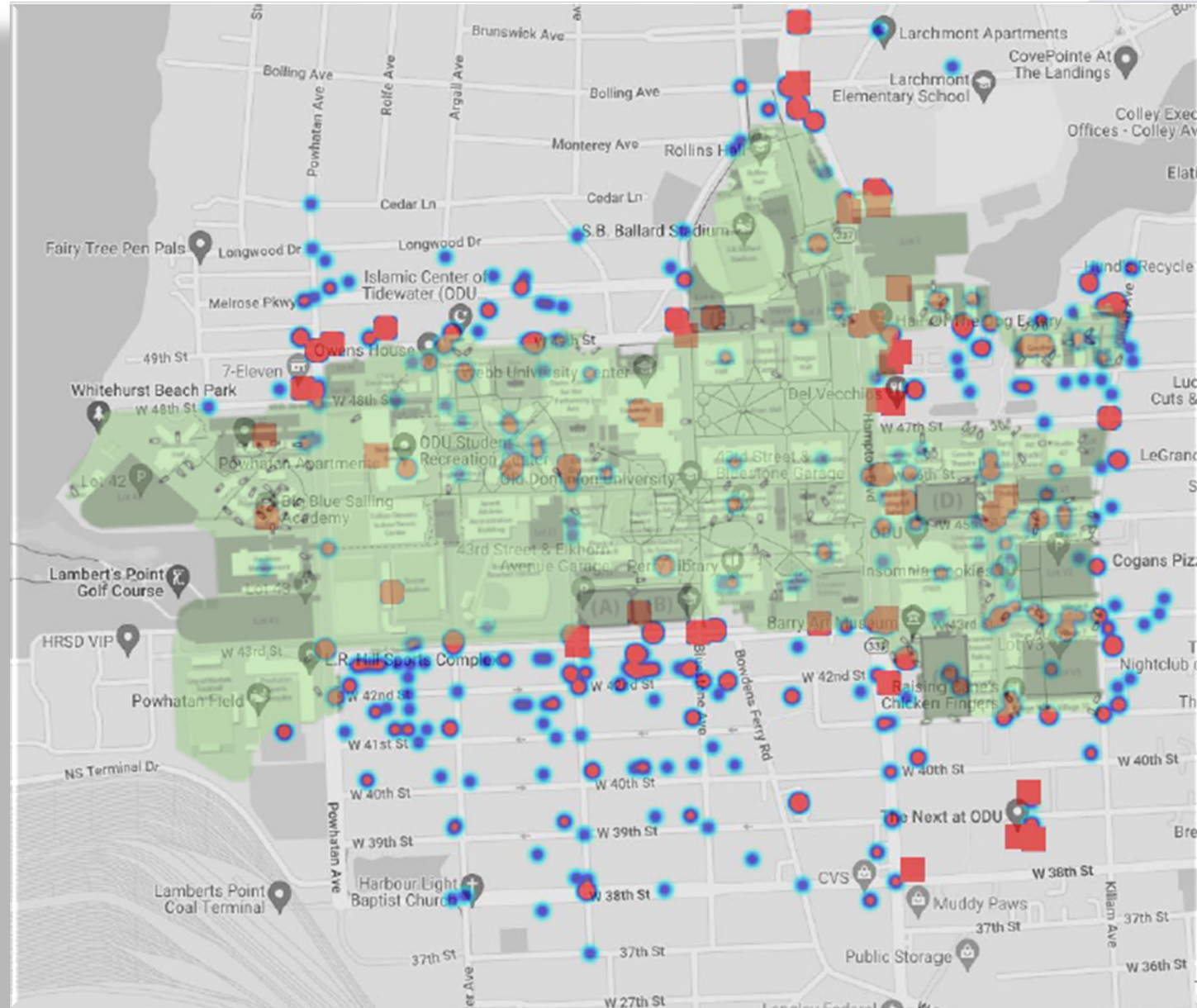


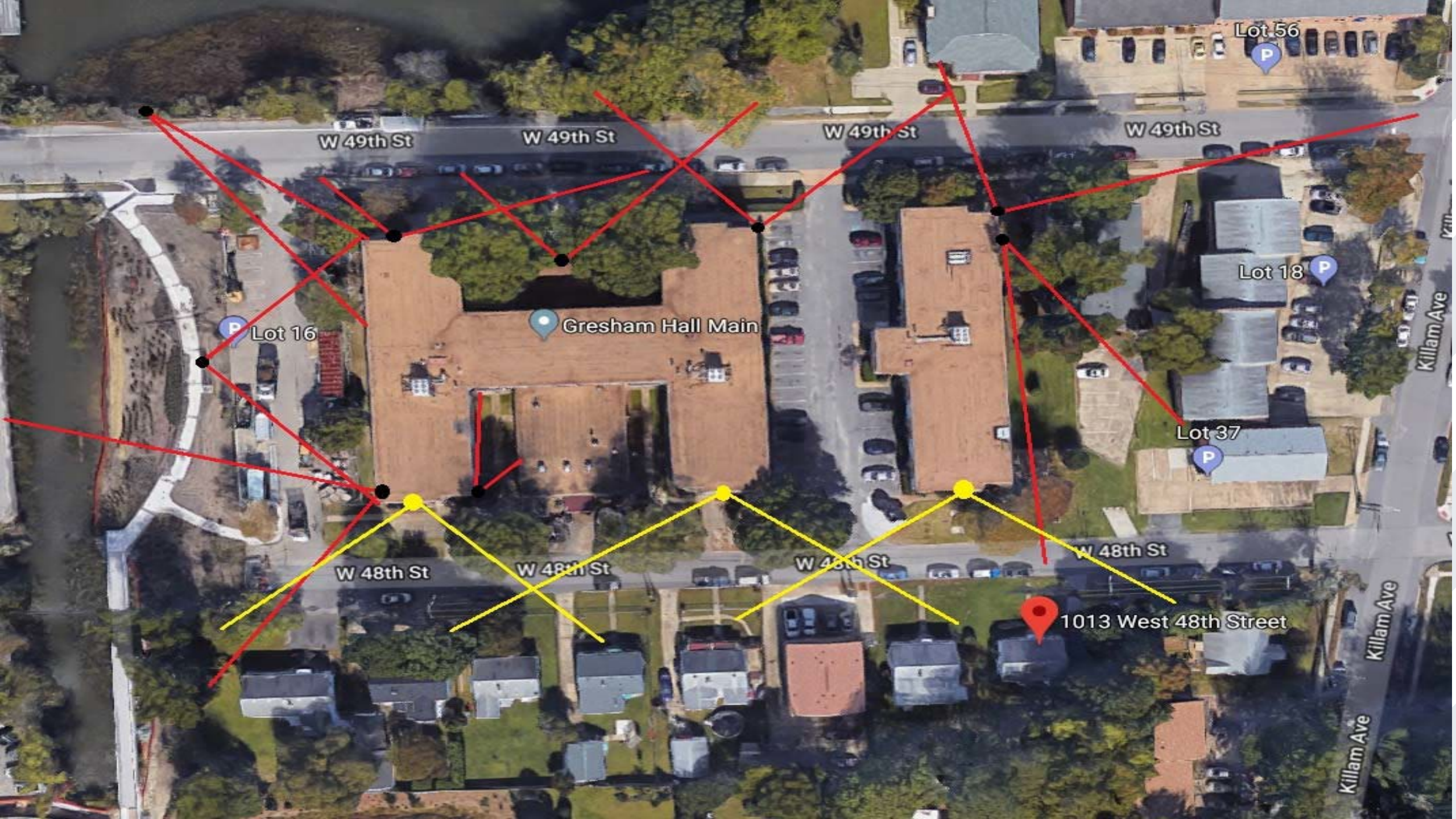
Crimes vs. Camera Locations

Evaluation:

1. Assess camera placements for exteriors along main corridors.
2. Evaluate locations for bike racks to install or relocate cameras.
3. Audit current cameras to ensure angle and function.
4. Assess current Video Management System (VMS)
