FINANCIAL AID ELIGIBLE HOURS

As you are registering for summer and/or fall, if you see that one or more courses is not showing as "aid eligible", that means according to your degree requirement report, you don't need the class(es) to graduate.

Classes that can be counted as financial aid eligible:

- count toward your degree or general education requirements,
- are required for your major,
- are required for your minor, or
- •fulfill your electives to reach a minimum of 120 credit hours.

To find out if a class is financial aid eligible, look in MyMadison, you will see a "Yes" or "No" under the "Eligible for Financial Aid" column in "My Class Schedule".

SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS

All undergraduate and graduate students must meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) requirements to receive financial aid. Federal regulations require each institution to have a SAP policy, which establishes the minimum academic standards for financial aid eligibility.

The evaluation of your academic progress happens once per year after spring grades post. If you are unable to meet SAP requirements, you could lose your eligibility for financial aid, including federal loans.

Students may appeal denial of financial aid if they could not meet SAP requirements due to extenuating circumstances.
