Governance

The Presidency

The INU presidency rotates between members every two years.

For 2021-2023, the presidency is held by European University Viadrina (Germany).

The secretariat (INU coordinator) is based at Kingston University (UK)

The Executive Committee

The Executive Committee is an advisory committee of the Council.

- Composed of the INU President, the INU Coordinator and a minimum of three appointed member institutions elected by the Council.
- Meets at least twice a year, prior to the Council meetings
- Makes recommendations to the INU Council



Governance

INU Council

The Council determines the policy of the network and takes all decisions concerning the network, the activities and the programmes of the network.

- Meets twice a year
- Includes two representatives from each member university

- 2021: "Understanding Global Inequalities: Bridging the Gaps"

- \$2,000 award to study at an INU member university
- Reflective essay following the International Student Seminar
- Fees are waived by the INU member

- Hosted and led by UNPAR (Indonesia) since 2013
- Key themes which include:
 - 2023 "Inclusivity and Accessibility to Welfare and Sustainable Living After the Pandemic"
 - 2019 "Global Transportation and Mobility: Attempting for a Better Living"

Staff Knowledge Exchange


- Aims to strengthen the links between members, sharing best practice and facilitating collaboration

Researcher Mobility Program

- Aims to develop joint research initiatives between INU member universities and to share expertise between research centres.
 - Visits of 2-4 weeks
 - 5 awards of up to \$2,000 each year







Seed Money Fund

- An open seed funding call to support creative initiatives supporting internationalisation and global engagement within INU
- Two phases of funding
 Phase 1 new projects
 Phase 2 expanding projects
- Four grants of up to \$3,000 available each year
