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## **I. Call to Order**

Dr. Linda Thomas, Dean, called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m.

## **II. Business Items**

### **A. Graduate Student Association Report**

The Graduate Student Association (GSA) officially commenced the 2024-2025 academic year with a General Board Meeting on September 3rd, 2024. A total of 31 graduate students participated, both in person and via Zoom. During the meeting, the GSA introduced the following planned activities for the semester:

- Hiking and Self-Care Chat: September 28th at Fridley Gap
- Movie Night: October 23rd at the University Program Board (UPB) Movie Theatre
- Talk: Artificial Intelligence, Stress, and Grad School: 12:00 p.m., October 11<sup>th</sup>.
- The last General Board Meeting of the semester is scheduled for December 2<sup>nd</sup> at noon.

Additionally, the GSA announced the opening of applications for the Professional Development Grant on September 1st, which will remain open until November 17th.

The GSA also maintains an active presence on social media platforms, including Facebook, Instagram, and GroupMe, where updates and event information are regularly shared. A new feature, the Grad Student Spotlight, will soon highlight graduate students.

During the General Board Meeting, attendees raised concerns about the lack of tailored career support for JMU's graduate students. They pointed out that the Career Center predominantly serves undergraduates and expressed the need for additional resources to assist graduate students in their job search after graduation.

### **B. Curriculum Report**

The first meeting of the Graduate Council Committee will be held on Thursday, September 26.

Curriculum proposals need to be submitted to Modern Campus. It is the same software previously called Curriculog.

## C. Recruitment Report

As of the Fall census, JMU had 1,775 enrolled graduate students. (7.75% of overall population—22,913)

This was 104% of OIR's projection.

Graduate enrollment had been dropping, primarily from the loss of 5<sup>th</sup>-year M.A.T. programs. Now stabilized:

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International Applicants were way up:

- 303 applications received for Fall 2024 (Up from 255 in 2023 and 179 in 2022)
- 118 applicants recommended for admission
- 103 applicants accepted their offer.
- Additionally, 15 applicants who first applied for Fall 2023 and were matriculated for Fall 2024
- 53 students completed their I-20.
- 37 new students arrived and enrolled during Fall 2024. (Total 106—a record high)
- Additionally, 43 applicants who first applied for Fall 2024 deferred for Spring, Summer or Fall 2025.

In August, students experienced significant trauma and delayed arrivals because of:

- Late admission decisions
- Late (or no) offers of assistantships
- Delayed (or inability to) submit a financial declaration
- Long delays in visa appointments at US embassies
- Initial denial or delayed issuance of visas

TGS and ISSS will work with the Graduate Council Executive Committee to develop recommendations, policies, and procedures to address these concerns.

## C. Approval of Graduate Council Curriculum Committee membership

The Curriculum Committee is responsible for making all curriculum decisions on behalf of the Graduate Council. Curriculum Committee members can but are not required to be members of the Graduate Council.

For the Graduate Council Curriculum Committee, the Graduate Council must choose one representative from each college's Graduate Faculty. Members do not have to be Graduate Council members or Program Directors, but these individuals are eligible for this committee. In addition, the Graduate Council must choose one at-large graduate faculty member to represent all master's programs and another who will represent all doctoral programs.
