We were delighted to have Dr. Lance Kearns, JMU Professor Emeritus of Geology and the Curator and Founder of the Mineral Museum with us. Dr. Kearns, assisted by his wife, Dr. Cindy Kearns, Assistant Professor of Geology and **Collections Manager of the Mineral** Museum, provided nearly 50 attendees with a delightful tour of the recently opened Mineral Museum, located in the lower level of the Festival. A wine reception preceded the tour.

Last year, JMU received the Peter Via Collection, valued at \$16.8 million--the largest gift the university has ever been given. The museum is open on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 11am to 3pm and is free to the public.

The FEA thanks Dr. Kearns, who went beyond the call of duty by providing tours from a wheelchair, after breaking his knee in a recent fall. Thanks again to Lance and Cindy, who are real JMU "Rock Stars!"
