- Run 3-10 weeks and offer 3-9 credits






Summer Internship Programs

Why Study Abroad?

Students who have international experience gain <u>leadership</u> and <u>time management</u> skills, are <u>more adaptable</u> and <u>open-minded</u>, and have a greater ability to <u>deal with ambiguity</u>.

What does it cost?

JMU Semester Programs

- Regular JMU Tuition
- Room & board
- Supplemental program fee (approx. \$5,500)

JMU Short-Term Programs

- Regular JMU Tuition (3-9 credits)
- Program fee depends on number of weeks and destination (as low as \$500 and as high as several thousand)

What's covered by JMU

What do I get for that price?

Academic credits

- Program related expenses, including:
 - Housing
 - Most or all meals*
 - Excursions
 - In-country transportation

- Health insurance
- Admissions and entry fees
- Books



- Airfare
- Personal expenses (passport, free travel expenses, etc.)

There are various types of financial aid available for both short-term and semester programs.



Finding financial support

What aid is available?

Semester Programs

- Your regular financial assistance
- Additional loan eligibility

Summer Programs

- Federal direct student and parent PLUS loan Must enroll
 in at least 6 credits and still have eligibility
- Private student loans No academic credit limit for most lenders

What aid is available?

JMU Study Abroad Scholarships

- Scholarships available for both JMU Summer and semester programs
- Many are need-based scholarships

Other Scholarships

- Outside scholarships (Boren, Fund for Education Abroad, Gilman, etc.)
- JMU departmental scholarships

Pro tip: Don't be afraid to ask for help!

Any student that has high financial need has been awarded a scholarship.

- 1. Follow us on Instagram @jmuglobal

- 4. Apply to study abroad early 1 year in advance
 - Applications open <u>September 1</u>, priority deadline is <u>November 1</u>, final deadline <u>March 1</u>
 - Apply by November 1 for CGE Scholarships
- 5. Join us at the Study Abroad Fair on Thursday, September 26th
- 6. Meet with a Global Duke or Study Abroad Advisor
- 7. Get a passport!
