## Sept. 6, 2012

Members of the Harrisonburg Police Department continue investigating an armed robbery that took place overnight.

On Sept. 5, around 11:30 p.m. three males reported they were victims of an armed robbery.

The victims were at a vehicle in a parking lot, which is located in the 1300 block of Hunters Road. Several offenders approached the victims, displayed a handgun, and took money, a wallet, and a cell phone from the victims.

After the incident the offenders fled from the scene in a vehicle. There were no reported injuries from this incident. Patrol officers and investigators worked together to locate the offenders involved in this robbery.

All offenders involved in this incident are in police custody and charges are pending.
